FARMINGTON
"It's crab tree time again" announces Mrs. Fred Ely, chairman of the Farmington Garden Club's annual sale of crab trees, one of the sure signs that spring is on the way.

For many years the Farmington Garden Club has sold Almy crab trees, a lovely rose-flowered crab that is Farmington's official tree.

This year a new improved version of the Almy crab will

be offered. Like its older prototype, the improved Almy has carmine buds that open to large crimson flowers. These are followed in fall by maroon red fruit.

The bark has a red glow, and the new leaves are that unfold in Spring are that plant, which grows to 20 feet will tolerate a wide variety of soil conditions. Another advantage of the new variety is that it is somewhat more upright than the older form and less brittle so branches

are less apt to be broken in a storm.

ALSO BEING offered this year are two other crabs; Hopa, which has bright pink flowers, and White Beauty, which has large white flowers that unfold from pink buds.

The Hopa is an old favorite that is a sturdy, strong-growing tree, ultimately reaching 18-20 feet. It is covered in spring with fragrant bright pink flowers, and from mid-summer clusters of

small red crabapples gleam along the branches. If the birds don't claim them first, they can be harvested and made into jelly.

The foliage is a rich maroon in spring, changing to green by summer. This, too, is a hardy easy to grow crab that will thrive in almost any soil.

White Beauty combines beautifully with the pink and red flowered crabs. The parent tree was discovered growing in Calloway Gardens

in Georgia, and is noted for its three-quarter inch bright waxy red fruits that are as good for jelly as for decoration.

The White Beauty has a vase-shaped semi-spreading form and ultimately grows to be 20 feet tall. This variety, like the others selected for sale, is especially hardy and disease resistant.

Orders must be placed before March 21. The trees will be available for planting the week-end of April 24 and 25. Distribution will be made from the Farmington Community Center.
