The Vatican's Sacred Coorgegation for the Doctrine of the Faith has quite sensibly announced that it will no longer use the word heretic. And rather than reacting to variant opinion with fire, sword, or obloquy suggesting eternal damnation, it will instead censure as erroneous and this only after due consultation with the accused, his bishop and two independent theologians. ent theologians.
