The conference will last from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and will cost \$2.50.

Speakers will include personnel from the Michigan Office of Highway Planning, the State Police Department, Traffic Safety for Michigan, and the Highway Traffic Safety Center, Continuing Education Service, MSU. All are support agencies for MWPHS.

Representatives of the Michigan Department of Education or the Michigan Driver Education Association and the Safety and Traffic Division, Michigan Department of State Police, and regional officials will also speak.

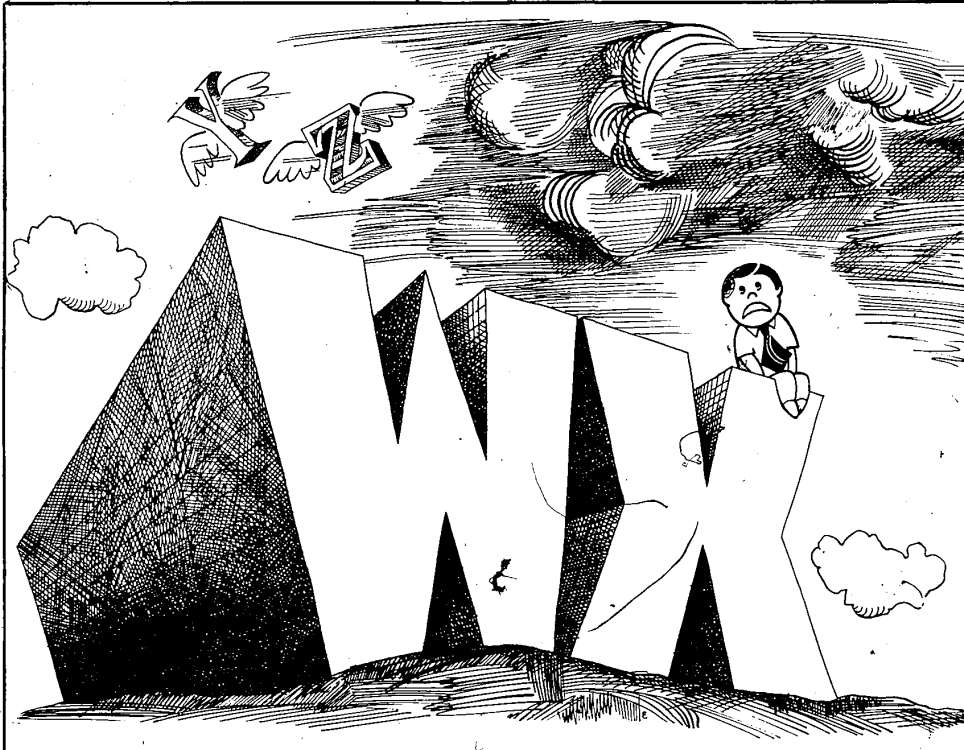
