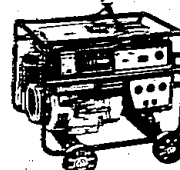

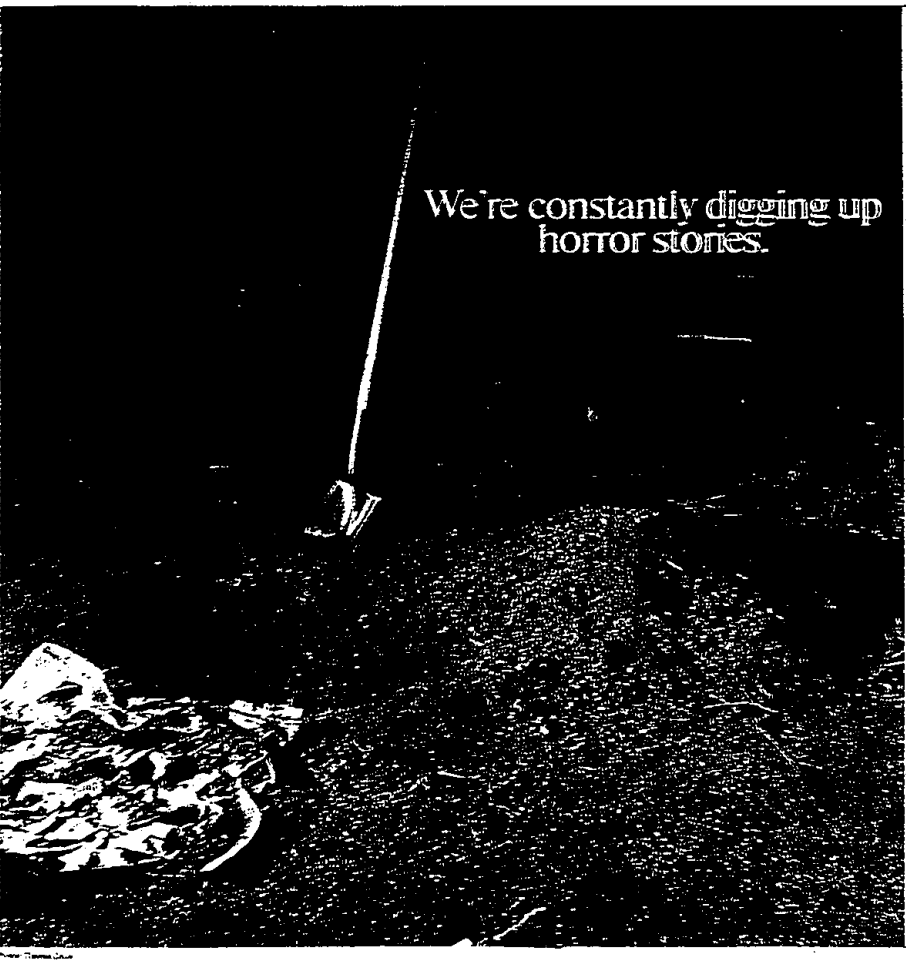
The Board of Education reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids or to award the contract to other than the low bidder.
