### CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING MEETING JULY 22, 1991

Mayor Vagnozzi called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Members Present: Mayor Vagnozzi, Mayor Pro-Tem Grant, Bates, Fox, Lichtman, Marks and Sever. Others Present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Dornan, Assistant City Manager Call, Assistant to the City Manager Brock, Director of Public Services Blaisell, Director of Planning and Community Development Coutegan, Planning Consultant Coates and City Attorney Donohue.

**COUNCIL:**

- Referred proposed Ordinance adding regulations dealing with temporary signs to Staff for study with further consideration by Council scheduled for August 12, 1991.
- Authorized the Mayor and City Manager to provide recommendations relative to the mission and membership of an ad hoc committee to deal with senior adult facilities.
- Adopted recommendations relative to electric power outages.
- Set date of August 19, 1991, for public hearing for Power Road vacation between Colfax Avenue and Eight Mile Road.
- Appointed Mayor Vagnozzi as voting delegate and Mayor Pro-Tem Grant as alternate to the Michigan Municipal League.

**APPROVED INTRODUCTION OF AMENDMENT TO CITY CODE:**

- Section 34-55, amending special conditions required for Home Occupations.
- Section 34-57B, amending permitted structures and uses, including signs for Centers for Elderly Care and Services in an SP-5.
- Section 34-543, to delete the requirement that a permit number be affixed to certain signs.
- Chapter 34, dealing with temporary signs and window signs.

**APPROVED:**

- City participation in the Oakland County Future Visions 2010 program.
- Tri-party program and award of contract for road resurfacing to Dan's Excavating in the amount of \$98,073.50 for Orchard Lake Road, North of Ten Mile to Eleven Mile Road.
- Special Event License for Kruger Supermarket located at 37550 W. Twelve Mile Road to hold a Muscular Dystrophy Fund Raiser from August 22 - September 3, 1991.
- Employment for part-time Parks and Recreation Employee under Section 10.01A of the City Code.
- Entering into executive session to discuss Twelve Mile Road right-of-way acquisition and pending litigation.

### CITY OF FARMINGTON CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Richardson at 8:00 p.m. on July 15, 1991, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 247-1976.

**PRESENT:** Hartcock, McShane, Richardson, Tupper, Yoder.

**OTHERS PRESENT:** City Manager Deadman, Deputy Director Gao, Director Billing, Adm. Assistant Schultz, City Clerk Busby.

Minutes of the previous meeting of July 1, 1991, were approved as written. Council held a Public Hearing on Special Assessment District 01-79 re: Necessary Parking Lot Improvements. Minutes of other Boards were received and/or filed.

Council denied the requested sign variance for First Federal of Michigan, 23220 Farmington Road. Council granted the requested sign variance to Oak Farms Market for a period of six months.

Council introduced Ordinance No. C-587-91 to rezone lots 113 and 114, Floral Park Subdivision.

Council adopted the following resolutions:

- Requesting State Legislature to authorize a third judgebill;
- Allowing Farmington Hills bonding attorney to prepare appropriate ballot language to issue \$1.8 million in bonds for expansion/renovation of 47th District Court;
- Adopting policy prohibiting painting street addresses on City curb;
- Amending original authorization of participation in Evergreen/Farmington Sewer Disposal System Pollution Control Project;
- Authorizing payment of \$435,871.80 to Posen Construction, Inc., for work completed on Contract No. 1, Sewer Improvement Project;
- Authorizing payment of \$60,666.18 to Black and Veatch for work completed on Contract No. 2, Sewer Improvement Project.

Public comments and announcements were heard. Council appointed Evanshia Samra to the Farmington Area Arts Commission for another three years. Monthly bills were approved for payment. Meeting adjourned at 9:17 p.m.

On or about August 12, 1991 the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project:

Salisbury Ambeth Storm Drainage Improvements including the installation of approximately 2800 linear feet of 12-inch to 18-inch storm drain pipe as well as catch basins and ditching on Salisbury and Ambeth.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly, the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows: The proposed project will require only minor alterations to the landscape and will not destroy or interrupt natural features of the surrounding environment, such as but not limited to water courses or wildlife.


An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request at the Planning office between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County to the City Manager at 31555 W. 11 Mile, Farmington Hills, Michigan 48336. Such written comments should be received at 31555 W. Eleven Mile Rd., Farmington Hills, Michigan 48336 on or before August 9, 1991. All such comments so received will be considered and the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Farmington Hills will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Farmington Hills is certifying to HUD that Farmington Hills and William M. Costick in his official capacity as City Manager, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon final approval, Farmington Hills may use the Block Grant funds, and HUD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept an objection to its approval of the release of funds and acceptance of the certification only if it is one of the following bases: (a) That the certification was not in fact executed by the chief executive officer or other officer of applicant approved by HUD, or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding, or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58), and may be addressed to HUD at Department of Housing and Urban Development, Federal Building, 476 Michigan Avenue, Detroit, Michigan 48226. Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD. No objection received after August 27, 1991 will be considered by HUD.
