On the day she wrote this letter, she was feeling irrepresible optimism. However, her moods can go from the peaks to the pits, sometimes without too much provocation.

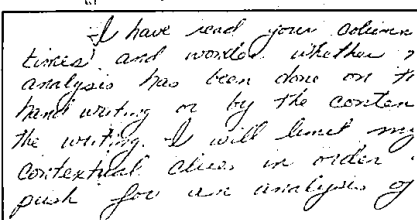
