"The system set up by Republicans is the same one that gave us Jim Lanni," said commissioner Lawrence R. Pernick, D-Southfield. "It's

The road commission is officially a ponpartisan appointment filled by a vote of the entire county board. The appointment becomes partisan, hiwever, when members of the majority party vote along party lines.
With the GOP controlling the county board since 1980, (live of the last road commissioners over the isst decade have been flepublicans.
Two of the five — Lanni and Gnau – both faced prison terms after being charged with felonies.
