

Baptist Church Launches New Program

The First Baptist Church of Livonia has entered a program of progress to provide better facilities for the community. The church is beginning remodeling of its facilities at 1735 Grand River with a total cost of more than \$35,000 pledged over the next five years.

There also are preliminary plans for a new sanctuary. The church over a year ago employed the Hahn Associates, of Birmingham, to conduct an internal and external audit of the church and community. Dr. Ray Hein, president of the firm suggested updating the present facilities and change planning for the future.

Ten Area Parishes Join New Series

Most Catholics Want Increase In Church Unity

Many Catholics are convinced that their church started at least a half-century behind Protestants in working for unity among Christians, and they want to catch up immediately.

At the same time they want to put new emphasis on practical showings of brotherly concern for Jews and other non-Christians.

The Rt. Rev. Monsignor Albert A. Matyn reacted this to Archbishop John F. Dearden, based on a study of 198 computer-produced summaries of dozens of prayer on which interfaith services would be held to invoke God's blessing on the nation.

"THERE IS A SMALL minority who think the church is obligated to attend Mass every Sunday, but the great majority of our people want unity yesterday," said Msgr. Matyn. "Many are eager for changes that are beyond the powers of an archdiocesan synod."

"A typical proposal of this kind is that attendance at any Christian church should fulfill the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. Another is that priests be permitted to give Holy Communion to baptized non-Catholics being married at a Nuptial Mass. Proposals of this kind, which lie outside the jurisdiction of the Synod, are being forwarded to Archbishop Dearden with the recommendation that he bring them to the attention of proper church bodies."

MSGR. MATYN added that additionally there were numerous proposals for group actions, many of which are either already in existence or under consideration. Some examples include:

- Organization of inter-faith young adult groups in retreats, to the United States.
- The choir sings hymns, classics and Chinese folk songs and members play western instruments and oriental instruments, including the hsaio sen and the pip-a.
- With the exception of three who have partial sight, all are either blind from birth or from childhood. Many do not know their parents, growing up in refugee camps and orphanages.

Unique Choir Visits

The Hong Kong Blind Choir, sponsored by Chinese for Christ, will be at the Southfield Community Church, 21222 Ingham, at 11 a.m. Sunday morning, Oct. 13.

The choir, first of its kind to come to the United States from the Orient, has sung before the King and Queen of Thailand and performed in the church of President Chiang Kai Shek in Taipei, Taiwan.

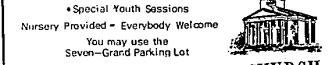
