St. Clare Launches New Religious Education Idea

St. Clare of Assisi Catholic Parish on Ten Mile Road in Farmington, will begin a program of "Total Religious Education of Children" kindergarten through 12th grade, Monday, Oct. 14.

Known as "T.R.E.P." by the pastor of St. Clare, the Rev. Joseph Drogowski, and the coordinators, Sister Mary Emma R.S.M. and Sister Jean Elizabeth O.S.F., the new concept in religious training will serve almost 500 children.

T.R.E.P. stands for Total Religious Education Program. St. Clare Parish will never have a full time school (teaching all subjects) as most Catholic parochial schools have done in the past. T.R.E.P. will teach all the children of the parish who attend public school rather than have a small full time school which can only serve a small percentage of the parishioners.

THIS "TOTAL" ideal extends to the adult level, also. Plans also are being made to include children four and five years old in a special program geared to their interests.

Three sisters from Mercy High School, in Farmington, will help in their special subjects; Sister Mary Gretchen, for fine arts; Sister Mary Laurentina R.S.M., for dramatics and Sister Diane R.S.M. for music.

"THE SCHOOL" will be staffed by members of the parish who have taught school or are now teaching. Each child will attend for a total of an hour and a half per week for the elementary grades coming for two 45-minute periods from 3:30 to 4:15 p.m. and the Junior and Senior High students attending in the evening from 7 to 8:30 p.m. one evening a week.

No classes will be held on Saturday. "Classes" will be kept to 20 children in the elementary grades and 10 for high school. This will enable the Sisters to have informal discussion groups.

For those who might find it more convenient, morning classes will be held from 7:50 to 8:35 a.m. for grade school children.

ONE UNUSUAL FEATURE is the fact that the two sisters who are the coordinators of the program are from different orders.

Sister Jean Elizabeth wears the royal blue street-length habit with a half veil (and a few silver curls showing in front) that Farmington people recognize as the new habit of the Holy Sisters.

Sister Jean Elizabeth has a floor length brown dress with an unusual boat-shaped turtle neck white collar and the familiar headband with the black veil of the Bernardine Sisters whose convent is at Ten Mile Road and Inkster.

BOTH ARE eminently qualified in teaching roles. Sister Mary Emma received her B.A. at Mercy College and the M.A. in library science at U. of M. She has her teacher's certification in Michigan. She has 30 years of teaching behind her in Michigan schools and is librarian at Mercy.

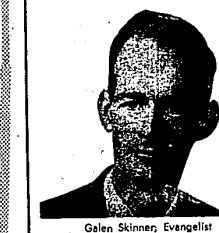
