

A year in the life of Jefferson

Two books about Thomas Jefferson and his life at Monticello are enlightening reading. "A Year at Monticello 1795," Donald Jackson (Fulcrum, \$17.95), traces Jefferson's daily life during 1795, while he enjoyed a respite from pub-lic office. His love of home, family and lands is

"Thomas Jefferson, The Garden and Farm Books," Robert C. Baron, editor, (Felicrum, \$20), was published in 1997 as the holiday book for that year, chosen because of its historical and biographical importance.

Henry S. Commager gives an overview of the country during the 170s, emphasizing the greatness and farsightedness of Jefferson. "ANTIQUE FLOWERS, ANNUALS," Yearly Classics for the Contemporary Garden, Rob Proctor (Harper Collins, \$429.85), is the second in a series on antique flowers.

Proctor traces the history of these plants in witty style. Descriptions and remarks that accompany the illustrations and photographs are interesting and informative. He also relates the way women have made an impact on the gardening scene.

"Daylliles," The Perfect Perennial, Lewis and Nancy Hill (Garden Way, 314.95, paper), will help you learn more about these plants from the history to bow to propagate them.
