### Mister Rogers puts on his top hat

In this week's series of five new episodes of *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*, host Fred Rogers explores the magic of dressing up and playing make-believe. The fun begins when cast member Maggie Stewart dresses up as Mr. McFeely to invite Mister Rogers to the neighborhood costume party.

Rogers, who tells his young viewers "It's you I like ... Not the things that hide you," will make and wear masks, try on hats and crowns and swap clothes with his friends in his neighborhood and the Land of Make-Believe to help children have a clearer understanding of who's who and why.

"All children, when they're young, need help in learning what makes them who they are as individuals," says Rogers. "It's not easy for any of us to understand just what it is that makes us lovable. We may confuse who we are with what we have or what others see in us."

Also included in the week's activities are two new "factory films" dealing with the making of two of Mister Rogers' sartorial musts: the making of sweaters and the making of sneakers.

Also on the schedule is a visit to a rehearsal of the Boys Choir of Harlem, with musical director Dr. Walter Turnbull as guide.

### Cable's ESPN earns laurels and respect

For over a decade, hard-core sports fans have turned to ESPN for the latest in highlights, updates and late-breaking stories. Beginning in September, the cable network starts its 13th season by adding an additional half-hour program to its already unsurpassed Sunday-morning block of award-winning sports coverage.

Sunday's lineup begins with an hour-long recap of the week's events on *SportsWeekly*, followed by a lively and sometimes heated discussion of the top stories in sports on *The Sports Reporters*. *SportsCenter*, the network's flagship news and information program, is next, followed by a preview of the day's football games on *NFL GameDay*.

ESPN earned numerous awards in 1990, including Emmys for studio programming, sports journalism and special reports, the National Headliner Award for its spot coverage of the death of Loyola-Marymount basketball player Hank Gathers and two New York Festival Awards for the coverage of Pete Rose's banishment from baseball.

In addition, the network took home three ACE and three *Cable Guide* Reader's Poll awards, as well as the Women's Sports Journalism Award for *Scholastic Sports America*.
