

### police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

**● ETHNIC INTIMIDATION**  
Information has been presented to the Oakland County prosecutor for review under the 1988 Ethnic Intimidation Statute involving a 17-year-old Farmington Hills man who is accused of shouting obscenities and racial slurs at a woman on Colgate Street, Sept. 7, according to Farmington Hills police.

According to a police report, two women, one of whom is black, were in a house on Colgate talking when a car with two occupants passed by the open front door. The occupants reportedly shouted racial slurs three separate times.

One of the women told police she was afraid to go outside for fear she would be assaulted by the car's occupants. The day before that incident, one of the women found a pair of pants hose stretched across a nearby fence. One of the car's occupants walked by her when she found the pants hose and shouted an obscene racial slur, according to the police report.

**● GUARD ASSAULTED**  
Two women face shoplifting and assault charges after attacking a security guard at T.J. Maxx, 33049 Grand River, Sept. 7.

According to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report, the guard was attacked and bitten in the left arm by one woman as she tried to stop her for stealing items from the store. The second woman came to her aid, punching the 22-year-old guard and kicking at her stomach.

The guard was taken to Botsford Hospital where she was treated for her injuries. The two women were arrested as they fled the scene eastbound on Grand River. Two other women with them were not charged.

The first woman, a 23-year-old from Detroit, was charged with retail fraud and felonious assault. The second woman, a 38-year-old from Detroit, was charged with retail fraud, simple assault, and never acquiring a drivers license. Both were arraigned on the charges in 47th District Court on Sept. 9 and were released on \$100 bond, pending preliminary examination.

**● POLICE INVESTIGATING**  
Farmington Hills police continue

to investigate an incident involving three teenage boys, two of whom claim the other threatened them with a club Sept. 8, at the Clark gas station, 24205 Orchard Lake Road, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

According to the report, two boys rode their bicycles through the gas station lot when another boy told them to go ride elsewhere. The two bicyclists ignored the boy.

Again the boys rode their bikes through the gas station lot when the boy shouted again and this time apparently pulled up his shirt and pulled a club from his waistband. The boy reportedly held the club over his head in a threatening manner, according to the report.

The boy walked toward the bicyclists, who rode off.

The boy with the club, however, told police that he was holding a black plastic stick with a key to the gas station bathroom and that he did not threaten the bicyclists.

If the allegations (of the two boys) are substantiated, there maybe

a juvenile court petition for some type of assault," said Detective Sgt. Charles Nebus of the Farmington Hills Police Department.
