Three Redford Township girls and one from Farmington will tour Europe this summer with Musical Youth International.

The Redford girls are Patricia Bushong, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Bushong; Susan Gierak, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Gierak; and Cathryn Brown, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Carlton Brown. The fourth traveler will be Linda Springmeier, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Springmeier.

They will make the tour with 104 talented musicians from 50 high schools in the Great Lakes area. The tour group is made up of a choir of 52 voices and a concert band. All three from Redford are in the choir and Miss Springmeier plays the bassoon with the band.

The group will perform in Holland, Belgium, Denmark,

Sweden, Poland and Germany, and then in Canada. Its members will stay in the homes of people in the cities they visit. They will begin the tour June 25.

Before the trip this summer, MYI has set up a tour of Michigan. It will include concerts in Monroe, April 18; Albion, May 9; S. Lyon, May 15; Zeeland, June 5; and Ann Arbor, June 23.

Zeeland is the sister-city of Kelle, Holland, where MYI will spend the first week of its European tour, and the

mayor of Zeeland and his wife will accompany the group on the tour.

Edward J. Downing, band director of Huron High School, Ann Arbor, is conducting the band for his third season. Raymond Voorhees,

music coordinator of Fenton Schools, is chorus director, also for his third season. Mrs. Lester McCoy of Ann Arbor is executive director. An experienced staff of 10 adults accompanies the group.
