ON THE OTHER hand, several members of the audience approached board members after the meeting to thank them for the affirmative vote.

Among them was Mrs. David Salberg of 2390 Briarcrest, a registered nurse and mother of three children attending the public schools. Another was Mrs. John Dreifus of 3236 Shrewsbury, who has a child at East Junior High.

The "Rights of Parents" statement appended by the board to the guidelines reads:

"We affirm the right and obligation of parents to teach their children the 'facts of life' and, more especially, the

meaning and significance of these facts."

"We affirm the right of parents to receive assistance from the larger community in the education of their children in human sexuality."

"We affirm the right of parents' access to books, group discussions and other educational experiences designed to help them carry out their roles as the primary sex educators of their children."

"We affirm the right of parents to be informed of the curricula, concepts and teaching materials used in the sex education of their children."

"We affirm the right of parents to withdraw their children from participation in

sex instruction, "without prejudice, if after careful personal study they find their own personal values are being subverted."
