## Inspiration Can Be A Matter Of Wattage

The reappearance of Daniels Den today has not been planned, foreseen or expected. It's just back, that's all.

A few weeks back, the Den was packed into a cardboard box for shipment to the new plant of Observer Newspapers, Inc. and has been lost until today. Misplaced would be a kinder word.

Seems like the Den was inadvertently, through no fault of the packers, placed in a carton filled with light bulbs of varying wattage.

**BECAUSE THE** new plant is illuminated with fluorescent lighting, no one had occasion to unpack the box of electric bulbs. In fact, the only reason the Den was discovered was because the staff became bored with hurling paper wads at each other.

But the Den has escaped from its cardboard embryo after penetrating through two full layers of masking tape. With that struggle ended, the Den will once again begin comment on what is or should be happening in Farmington.

Pledge cannot be given that the reappearance will be a more inspiring product although there is hope.

With the Den now free to assist the editor an invitation is now extended to Farmington folks to drop by (with warning) to visit at our new plant which is located at the southeast corner of Schoolcraft and Levan, the first stoplight west of Farmington Rd.

**DURING THE** past few weeks many interesting events have occurred, ranging from the violence at Orchard Ridge, the planning commission's rejection of the regional shopping center, adoption of a sex ed curriculum and the subsequent recall threats.

A few brief comments probably should be made about the attempted recall move. Recall has almost become a household word since the rebellion of taxpay-

ers in Al Zak's pack which wanted to give themselves huge pay checks as members of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Not a single commissioner was recalled (some were defeated, however, in subsequent elections) but the outcry has resulted in a spree of recall attempts throughout suburbia.

The threats in Farmington are particularly interesting from the point of deciding the strategy to be used because all school trustees voted yes on the sex education curriculum.

Will the recall backers petition to recall all seven trustees? Most of the trustees are conservative and backed by conservatives in the community. An attempt to recall all seven might well cause a backlash from the conservatives in Farmington.

But to ask recall of less than seven would not be consistent because sex ed received unanimous approval. It appears to me the only result of recalling all seven

would be to provide an opportunity to elect as school trustees members of the John Birch Society. Movement to Restore Decency (MOTOREDE) and Citizens United for Farmington Youth (CUFY).

The question could boil down to whether Farmington residents want to be represented by special interest groups with limited interests on the school board.

It could but it won't because this recall movement will abort itself before the supply of light bulbs are consumed.

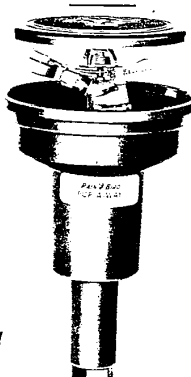
