

What's So Indecent About Learning Love?

The Movement to Restore Decency (Motorede) is one of the local organizations speaking out against a suggested program to foster minority understanding in Farmington School District.

The first question this observer has is to wonder what "deceit" has to do with minority understanding or human relations?

ONE COULD argue that it is the decent thing to do to love your brother and I'd buy that. But this argument would assume that Motorede should argue in favor of minority understanding, not against. Are we now to consider it indecent to love our brother? Is it indecent to hire black teachers in Farmington, to have black speakers for student assemblies, or to have oriental and black teachers exchange for a month with white Farmington teachers?

What was so indecent about the return of the prodigal son? Just because minority giving first aid to the Samaritan? Instructing the Ethiopian chariot rider? Saving an adulterous woman from a sure slaying? Giving pardon to the thief on the cross? Or dining with the tax collector?

So many people are more conservative than I. So many people may disagree with my views, but how interesting would it be if we all agreed? Just because minority understanding strikes me as being a worthy goal, however, has really nothing to do with my remarks on Motorede's position.

AFTER EXAMINING the minority understanding report, I can see nothing which involves specifically the issue of decency or indecency. Maybe some people still think it is indecent to mix blacks and whites in one school system, but it seemed that kind of thinking died with the Nazis' defeat.

Motorede has now gone on record as opposing sex education, substance abuse instruction and minority understanding efforts in

the Communists that Sen. Joe McCarthy chose to unveil. It is good to have organized opposition to sex ed, substance abuse and minority understanding; otherwise, why have public hearings or citizen councils?

But Motorede is confusing the public hearing process and misleading citizens. But I'm not even objecting to Motorede. I just wish they'd explain what was indecent about Philip going on a chariot ride in the desert with the Ethiopian?

THE fact is that Motorede, as an ad hoc arm of the John Birch Society, is following the party line on all three issues. If the group would not be ashamed to admit its John Birch lineage, and drop the Motorede tag, the question of what decency has to do with minority understanding would not have to be asked.

I'm not labeling everyone opposed to minority understanding as a John Birch or anything else. I am, however, objecting to Motorede attempting to hide its true intentions behind such a misleading title.

THE MOVEMENT to restore decency tag is being used to attract opponents who might have reservations about joining the John Birch Society. This is the same "front organization" tactic used by






Musical
