Colorado Is a Coal State

The state of Colorado ranks sixth among the coal-producing states of the United States and holds the same supremacy for coal and coke west of the Mississippi that Pennsylvania holds for the country as a whole.

The stratified rocks of the great plains, the parks and the plateaus hold a known supply of 33,897,800,000 tons of coal under a proven area estimated at 18,100 square miles, an amount of coal that would supply the United States for 60 years at the rate of 600,000,000 tons a year consumption.—Colorado Fuel and Iron Company Industrial Bulletin.
