N. Farmington Lists Girls Track

It's a tremendous schedule of athletic events that has been arranged for Farmington's three senior high schools this spring.

At Harrison, Farmington and North Farmington, they'll have variety teams in baseball, track, swimming and golf, according to the schedules released by athletic director Jack Cotton.
