**EDITORIAL**

**ONE MORE HURDLE**

The widening of Grand River  
 avenue to Farmington seems in  
 sight at last. Following the decla-  
 ration of Governor Green that  
 he would support the widening  
 program with all his power,  
 comes the welcome announcement  
 of the 1928 state highway pro-  
 gram suggested by Chief Engi-  
 neer G. C. Dillman, of the state  
 highway program, with the Grand  
 River project among the first of  
 the list.

With this list, to be recommend-  
 ed to the Administrative Board  
 of the State next Monday, the  
 final and highest visible barrier  
 to the realization of Wider Grand  
 River is before it, but there  
 seems little doubt of success  
 now.

If the Administrative Board  
 acts in accordance with indica-  
 tions, the bumps that appear and  
 multiply each day will seem less  
 sinister. We can expect that bet-  
 ter days are coming. Farming-  
 ton may, after Monday, sport a  
 huge "bump of satisfaction," and  
 repeat the immortal saying origi-  
 nated several months ago, "It  
 won't be long now."

**NOW THAT IT'S OVER\***

The three-cent gasoline tax has  
 passed its final test in the unani-  
 mous decision of the Supreme  
 Court that the act is legal in ev-  
 ery way.

Having passed the trial as to  
 legality, the only remaining be-  
 fore the law is that of public opin-  
 ion.

What will the people think of  
 it, now that the tax is definitely  
 here to stay?, is a question just  
 as important as the legality of  
 the enactment.

The decision of the Supreme  
 Court of Michigan determined  
 not only legality of the three-  
 cent gas tax, but indicated the  
 justice of the tax. The mere  
 fact that the decision was unani-  
 mous, is indicative of how the  
 three-cent tax looks in the eyes  
 of disinterested persons.

After all, it must be admitted  
 that most of the howling came  
 from Detroiters who saw through  
 green glasses on the tax matter  
 and who battled against the only  
 means by which highways such  
 as Grand River between Farming-  
 ton and Redford could within the  
 next few years be widened and  
 improved.

The three-cent tax places more  
 than ever before the burden of  
 road-building and maintenance  
 upon those who use the roads,  
 which is fair and just. The fact  
 that much of the gasoline oil  
 which three-cent tax is paid, is  
 burned up on Detroit streets may  
 make it seem a little heavy upon  
 Detroit. But it is fairer than  
 making property-owners pay most  
 of the cost of paved roads, upon  
 which city-dwellers may speed  
 past their homes at as many  
 miles per hour as they choose.

What a difference not a few  
 cents, but only one cent makes  
 especially if your own members  
 have to pay their share of it. It's  
 the old story of whose foot the  
 shoe pinches.
