

ORCHARD LAKE IS INCORPORATED AS VILLAGE BY VOTE

Need Of Fire and Police Protection, Induces Action; Charter Being Prepared

Residents living in the proximity of Orchard Lake voted at special election held this week at the West Bloomfield town hall to incorporate as a village, to be known as Orchard Lake.

At the same time they elected F. S. Strong, Jr., William H. Bow, Edward M. Horton, Loren C. Bow, and William H. Morley members of a charter commission. They will frame a charter and submit it for a vote within 60 days.

The territory incorporated entirely surrounds Orchard Lake, most of Upper Straits Lake, and touches Pine and Cass lakes.

Residents of this community who ride through the village, will be inside the limits from the sharp corner near Keego Harbor to the George Browning property. The population is not stated, but only that requirements are met according to the state law. The law specifies that the population must not be less than 225 and number's not less than 100 persons to the square mile.

The incorporation will fill the need for fire and police protection, besides other advantages.

An effort will be made to have the schools of Oakland county engage in races.

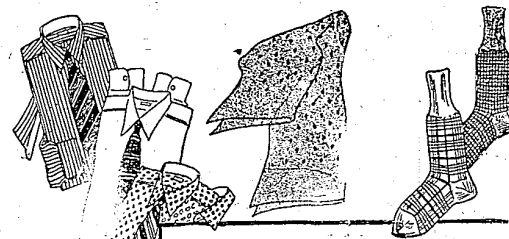
