Zukin's Gets Liquor License

FARMINGTON A Class C liquor license was approved Monday night for a sing-along barbeque restaurant to be built on the site of the Topps Department Store on Orchard Lake Rd. in Farmington Township.

The liquor license was approved by the township board by a 4-1 vote with Earl Oppertthausen dissenting.

RECIPIENT of the first liquor by the glass license granted in 1971 was the Zukin's Dial-A-Dinner Sing along Rib Shack to be built at the Topps complex on the east side of Orchard Lake just south of 14 Mile.

Hiram Dorfman, representing the restaurant, said it will be a high-class family eating place with a full menu offered.

Dorfman said the restaurant plans to serve only beer and wine but needed the Class C license since the state no longer issues tavern licenses, which were given for beer and wine sales.

The township recently received word from the Michigan Liquor Control Commission that it has a quota of 15 Class C licenses to grant between now and 1980.

Liquor licenses are allotted on the basis of population. After each census, a municipality is given additional licenses to grant based on its new growth.

Dorfman said if the license was not received by May 31, Zukin's would cancel its option to build on the Topps site and pull out.

With the license granted, construction will proceed

immediately because the shell of the building is already up, he added, and in about 120 days the township will begin accruing tax revenues.

OPPERTHAUSEN had asked if Zukin's would sign an agreement with the township that it would not serve liquor at any time in the future.

Dorfman said he would first have to check with the Zukin operators before making a commitment, but Treasurer Thomas Nolan objected that limitations should not be placed on the license, if granted.

Oppertthausen commented that the township had a long list of persons applying for liquor licenses, and this list

should be studied before approving one for Zukin's. Trustee Fred Lichtman said many of those requests were "just shots in the dark," and were made by persons with no proposed locations in mind.

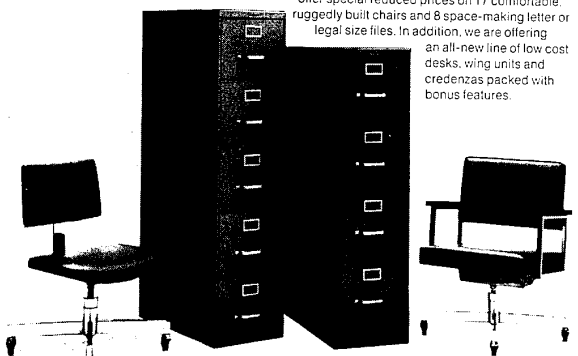
The board also approved a package beer and wine (SDM) license for a party store at 29970 Twelve Mile, across from Harrison High School.

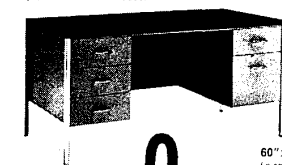


Secretarial Posture chair. Model T410-S10, vinyl upholstery, polished chrome base.
