John Ciardi, one of America's best-known poets and poetry editor of the "Saturday Review" will speak at Schoolcraft College Thursday, April 15.

His topic will be "Poetry—the Mind-expanding Art." His talk will be presented in the upper level of the Waterman Campus Center at 8 p.m.

Admission is free to Schoolcraft students and staff. Other students will be charged \$1 and the general public, \$2.

Ciardi's book, "How Does a Poem Mean," published in 1960 is used as a text at Schoolcraft.

Ciardi, born in Boston in 1918, received his M.A. from the University of Michigan in 1939. He received his B.A. magna cum laude from Tufts.

In 1946 he joined the English faculty at Harvard and the staff of the Bread Loaf Writers' Conference. He has been director of the conference since 1955.

In 1947 he met and married Judith Hostetter of Missouri. They have three children.
