What's Being Done? Spring Activates Ecology Disciples

FARMINGTON During spring greater emphasis is put upon ecology in the Farmington Area and the City of Farmington Beautification Committee is one of the most active groups engaged in saving the earth.

Mrs. Carol Kurth, committee chairman, explains that during the past year one of the committee's major efforts has been to serve as an advisory group within the community to make recommendations on local beautification.

"It has come to the attention of the committee that in this age of increasing concern about ecology, there are many groups that have approached us asking what they might do to better the Farmington environment.

"We are sure there are also many groups we do not hear from that are doing some very worthwhile projects and we would like to hear from them too."

AMONG THE current projects in Farmington this spring, she explains, is Arbor Week April 18-24 with April 21 being proclaimed as Arbor Day in the City of Farmington.

Mayor Wilbur Brotherton issued the proclamation which reads, in part: "We urge all residents to observe this week and Arbor Day by planting trees, shrubs and vines in the promotion of forest and orchard growth and culture in the adornment of public and private grounds."

On Saturday, April 24, the Cloverdale Elementary School PTA, under the direction of Mrs. Leroy LeGros and Mrs. Connie Jordan, will hold an intensive clean-up along Freedom Dr. in the Cloverdale area between Farmington and Orchard Lake Rds. Elementary pupils and parents will work from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., and then hold a picnic at the school.

During Arbor Week, the newly formed Chatham Hills Garden Club, consisting of members from the four-year-old subdivision, will sponsor a planting program called "Green-Up Time in Chatham Hills."

At 2 p.m., residents will gather in the subdivision park area to plant trees, shrubs and evergreens, all donated by residents. Over 125 families live in the subdivision and it is hoped most will participate in this project.

THE CITY'S beautification committee has once again invited all youth groups of the city to participate in local clean-up or planting programs.

Participating groups will be honored by having its name listed on the official scroll displayed in the city hall. Signatures of participating groups should be completed by the first of May to be recognized at the annual Awards Breakfast.

May will be observed locally and nationally as "Clean-up, Paint-up, Fix-up Month." A 17-minute color film, "The Litter Monster," will be shown at all elementary schools in Farmington during the week of May 10.

The Farmington Garden Club will again be holding its sale of Almay Crab trees during May. Exact times and locations to purchase trees will be announced by the club.

The Farmington Community Center will be selling geraniums at reasonable costs on May 14, 15, 16.

Over 90 trees have been ordered by the City of Farmington.

ON MAY 15, the third annual Awards Breakfast will be held at 8 a.m. in the Farmington Masonic Temple to recognize outstanding businesses, apartments, service stations and organizations for efforts in beautification, improvement and renovation.

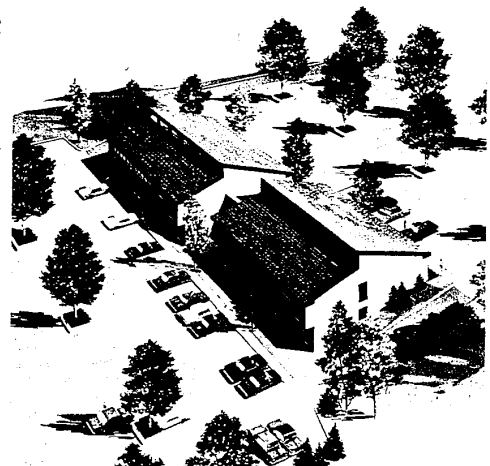
The event will be held on Community Pride Day during Michigan Week with guest speaker being John Corville, Farmington chairman of the Michigan Week observance.

Barnett Dickman was elected corresponding secretary last month of the Southeastern Beautification Council meeting.

The committee has placed suggestion boxes in the Community Center, City Hall, District Library and Frank's Nursery and hope residents will use them.

"Only through total commitment by our community can we continue to maintain the high standards of quality environment which we all want," Mrs. Kurth concludes.

It is not up to the folks next door to get involved, it is everyone's job to keep Farmington Beautiful."

Medical Complex Will Locate Here

FARMINGTON Plans have been announced this week for a \$1.5 million office condominium for physicians and dentists to be located in the Thompson-Brown Office Center at 12 Mile and Farmington Rds. in Farmington Township.

The 25,000 square foot center will be developed by Property Development Group, Inc. of Ann Arbor as a joint venture with Amurcon Corporation of Dearborn.

RALPH BERGSMAN, PDG president, says Thompson-Brown is the exclusive sales agent and is taking reservations now for individual suites ranging from 500 to 6,000 square feet.


The condominium, called the Quakertown Medical Arts Building, will be attractive to physicians and dentists because it offers ownership of offices and because it is close to the Orchard Lake exit of I-696, Bergsman says.

The location will provide easy access for physicians to Providence Hospital in Southfield, William Beaumont in Royal Oak and St. Mary in Livonia.

THE BUILDING can house about 20 physicians and dentists. It will be managed by a professional management corporation under direction of a committee consisting of office and unit owners.

The facility will be air-conditioned and, according to Bergsman, arrangements can be made to provide for such special requirements as compressed air, special electrical circuits and gas lines, and special floor, wall and ceiling finishes.


A spring groundbreaking with occupancy in the fall of this year is anticipated.




