Report of Committee
Your committee appointed to examine and report on the petition filed with this Board of certain citizens of the Township of Royal Oak and City of Royal Oak for the Annexation of certain territory to be taken from the Township of Royal Oak and annexed to the City of Royal Oak, beg leave to report and recommend as follows:

We find that the annexation is to be made under Act 578 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan for the year 1927 and acts amendatory and supplementary thereto. The lands proposed for annexation in said petition are all owners and parcels of land situated and being in the Township of Royal Oak, County of Oakland and State of Michigan, and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the intersection of the center line of the Twelve Mile Road, or Oakwood Boulevard, so-called, with the center line of Main street, so-called; thence easterly along the center line of Twelve Mile Road, or Oakwood Boulevard, so-called, to its intersection with the center line of Rochester Road, so-called; thence southerly along the center line of Rochester Road, so-called, to its intersection with the east and west quarter line of Section Three (3); thence westerly along the said quarter section line to the west quarter post of Section Three (3); said post being in the center line of Main street, so-called; thence southerly along the center line of Main street, so-called, to the point of beginning; all of said territory being in the Township of Royal Oak and not in any village or city, but adjacent to the present city limits of the City of Royal Oak, Oakland County, Michigan.

We find that the said petition was filed with the County Clerk over 30 days prior to the present session of the Board of Supervisors, as required by law; that proper affidavits are attached and all said proceedings appear to be regular and in accordance with the statute.

We, the undersigned qualified electors, residing within the Township of Royal Oak, or the City of Royal Oak, do hereby petition your honorable body to pass a resolution in accordance with Act 578 of the Public Acts of Michigan for 1927, and acts amendatory and supplementary thereto, admitting to the qualified electors of the Township of Royal Oak and qualified electors of the City of Royal Oak, Oakland County, Michigan, the question of annexing to the City of Royal Oak and detaching from the Township of Royal Oak, the following proposed territory and boundary to said City, described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the intersection of the center line of the Twelve Mile Road, or Oakwood Boulevard, so-called, with the center line of Main street, so-called; thence easterly along the center line of Twelve Mile Road, or Oakwood Boulevard, so-called, to its intersection with the center line of North West street, so-called, to its intersection with the east and west quarter line of Section Nine (9); thence easterly along the quarter line of Section Nine (9) to its intersection with the center line of Main street, so-called; thence southerly along the center line of Main street, so-called, to the point of beginning; all of said territory being in the Township of Royal Oak and not in any village or city, but adjacent to the present city limits of the City of Royal Oak, Oakland County, Michigan.
