Mr. and Mrs. Blair are visiting in Farmington.

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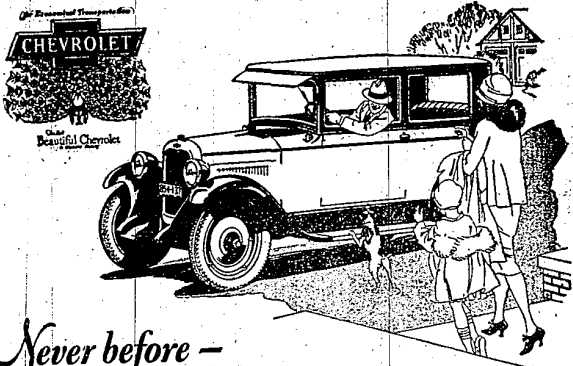
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
