

MICHIGAN MAPLE SUGAR

INDUSTRY IS DECLINING

The maple sugar industry has been slowly but steadily declining for many years, due to the reduction in number of maple trees on farms. The survey made this year by Verne H. Church, U. S. Agricultural Statistician for Michigan and Herbert E. Powell, Commissioner of Agriculture not only shows a reduction of four per cent in the number of trees tapped, but a much smaller production per tree in comparison with last year.

Last year, the estimated yield was 2.90 pounds per tree or a total production of 300,000 gallons of syrup and 100,000 pounds of sugar. The average price this year was \$2.57 per gallon for syrup and 37 cents per pound for sugar. The 1926 crop made a grade of 99 per cent, being the finest quality produced in many years. Michigan holds fourth place in maple production.
