

Rain Makes One Wonder Who's First In Class 'A'

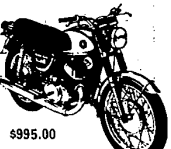
It takes a magician to figure out the schedule in the Greater Livonia Class 'A' baseball league.
