

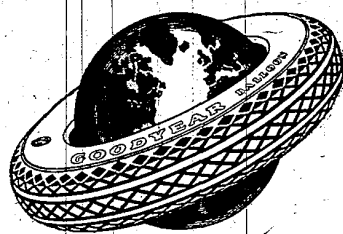
NORTH FARMINGTON

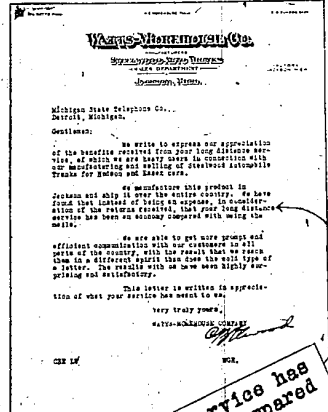

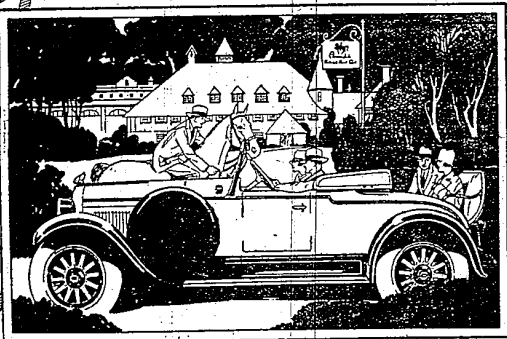
