## FACTS ABOUT THE TELEPHONE

Over three billion dollars is invested in the telephone plant and equipment in this country.

In proportion to population Michigan has five times as many telephones as Great Britain.

Fifteen of the original eighty telephone subscribers in the city of Seattle are still living.

On the night of the Municipal election in Chicago, the Chicago-Tribune received 40,000 telephone calls inquiring as to the result of the election.

Fifteen years ago there were 46,602 telephones in the state of Louisiana. Now there are 68,000 in the city of New Orleans alone and 135,000 in the entire state.

About 70 per cent of the homes in Nebraska villages have telephones, according to a recent study by an organization of women's clubs, covering 67 villages with populations of less than 1,000 each.

Rhode Island has approximately the same number of telephones as the combined cities of Bremen, Birmingham, Dublin, Marseilles and Rome, although it has only about one-fifth of the combined population of these five European cities.

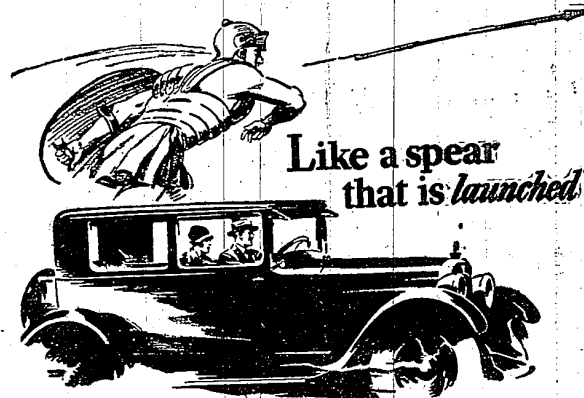
## MOSQUITOES CARRY DANGEROUS MALARIA
