

"BROADWAY" ENTERS ITS 14th WEEK AT GARRICK THEATRE IN DETROIT

Having broken all records for long runs in Detroit, with the single exception of "Abie's Irish Rose", Jed Harris' production of "Broadway", by Philip Dunning and George Abbott, enters upon its fourteenth week at the Garlick Theatre, Detroit, Sunday night. "The Student Prince", which opened the Shubert-Lafayette nearly two years ago and remained there for thirteen weeks for its first engagement in Detroit was the runner-up. The next nearest contender was "The Vagabond King" with eight weeks. No dramatic play other than "Abie" has lasted in Detroit longer than four weeks and "Broadway" must necessarily come under the dramatic classification although it has all elements for musical comedy.

"Broadway" is unique in that it has never received an adverse criticism and its popularity is so strong that many persons have witnessed the performance for three, four and five times and seemingly get as much satisfaction from the later visits as from the first.

The company is exceptionally good, including in the cast Wallace Ford, Joseph King, Grade Huff, Marshall Bradford, Harriet E. MacGibbon, Gustave Rolland, Lee Smith, Jay Wilson, Joseph Granby, Catherine Collins, Maurine Mayo and Allen Jenkins.
