

Annual School Meeting

ANNUAL MEETING OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 5 CITY AND TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON WAS HELD AT SCHOOL BUILDING AT 8 P. M. JULY 11, 1927.

Meeting called to order by President Fred L. Cook. Secretary read minutes of last annual meeting. Following this the secretary read the annual statement showing receipts and disbursements for the year 1926-27 and balance on hand in each fund. Motion made by H. M. Warner and supported by Mark Wixom that report be accepted and adopted as read. On vote same was carried. Motion was made and carried that the chairman appoint three tellers. Chairman appointed Frank Macomber, Nathan Power and James L. Hogie. Next followed the election of two trustees for the period of three years. To succeed D. L. Dickerson two candidates were placed in nomination Frank Macomber and Arthur Lamb before vote was taken Frank Macomber being a nominee withdrew as teller and A. G. Leonard was appointed in his place. On canvass of vote it was found that 79 ballots had been cast of which Frank Macomber received 59, Arthur Lamb 18, and Olin Russell 2. Frank Macomber having received the majority of votes cast was declared elected. For second trustee to succeed H. D. Warner only one candidate was nominated which was Arthur Lamb. Motion was made and carried that rules be suspended and secretary authorized to cast ballot as instructed and Arthur Lamb was declared elected trustee.

Motion made by Jas. A. Miller and supported by Frank Macomber that the Peoples State Bank of Farmington be made depository for the school funds for the years 1927-28. On vote same was carried. Following some questions relative to the sale of bonds of the district authorized on July 12, 1926 motion was made and carried that meeting adjourn.
