

Proceedings of Annual Meeting

District No. 6, Township of Farmington, Meeting held on the 11th day of July, 1927.

Meeting was called to order by Moderator Charles Werschm.

Minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.

Secretary's report was read and a motion made by Mr. Lindstrum and supported by Roy Cox that report be accepted as read. Carried.

Treasurer's report was read and a motion made by George Schulkins and supported by Mr. Crooks that report be accepted as read. Carried.

Election of an officer for a 3 year term. Mr. Wilkinson, Lindstrum and Schulkins were nominated. Total votes cast (33). Mr. Wilkinson (9), Mr. Lindstrum (4), Mr. Schulkins (23). Mr. Schulkins was elected for a term of 3 years.

Election of an officer for a term of 3 years. Motion made by Mr. Lindstrum and supported by Charles Rubert that Ray Oldham be elected by acclamation. Carried.

Election of an officer for a term of 2 years. Mr. Dickerson and Mr. Roy Livingston were nominated. Total votes cast (34). Mr. Dickerson (13), Roy Livingston (21). Roy Livingston was elected for a term of 2 years.

Motion made by Mr. Lindstrum and supported by Harold Noble that Mr. Ward be paid \$3.25 per foot for the two wells of 125 feet and 128 feet deep and be allowed \$45.00 for pumps a total of \$867.25. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Beck and supported by Charles Rubert that the buying of a school bus be laid on the table until next annual meeting. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Beck and supported by George Schulkins that the school term shall remain (9) months. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Naback and supported by Mr. Wilkinson that parents buy the text books for the children. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Beck and supported by Mr. Crooks that school board be allowed \$250.00 for playground equipment. Carried.

Motion made by Roy Cox and supported by Mr. Lindstrum that swings be taken down during the vacation. Carried.

Motion made by Ray Oldham and supported by Mr. Beck that buying of school site be laid on table until next annual meeting. Carried.

Motion made by Ray Oldham and supported by George Schulkins that \$15,000.00 voted tax be raised for the coming year.

Motion made by Mr. Wilkinson and supported by Mr. Crooks that \$1,000.00 be placed into a sinking fund each year for the purpose of retiring the present bond issue of \$24,000.00. Carried.

Motion made by Mr. Lindstrum and supported by Roy Livingston that this meeting adjourn until the second Monday in July, 1928. Carried.
