

# Arrest May End Breakins

**FARMINGTON**  
An alleged car burglar believed to have broken into or attempted to enter 27 homes in one week in Farmington Township was arrested Sunday by township police. Police Chief Irving Yates said an investigation, surveillance and chase by township detectives resulted in the arrest of the 25-year-old suspect Sunday in Detroit.

A warrant has also been obtained for breaking and entering, Yates says, and the suspect will be arraigned on that charge in Farmington, Township.

3. Said Special Assessment Roll shall be divided into ten (10) equal annual installments, the first installment within ten (10) days of the date of each annual installment, and the second and subsequent installments to be due on July 1, in each and every year thereafter.
