Rogers, State Highway Commissioner for improving 0.245 Miles of road in Novi Township, Oakland County, Michigan. The work will consist of grading and shaping the road, constructing the necessary drainage structures and surfacing the road to a width of twenty (20) feet and thirty (30) feet with concrete pavement.

Instructions to bidders, specifications and proposal blanks may be obtained at the office of the Resident Engineer, C. L. Cowgill at the above address and at the office of the State Highway Department, Lansing, Michigan. Please take Notice that this suit, in which the preceding Order was made involves and is brought to quiet the title to the following described lands situate in the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, known and described as follows:
