DIVORCE GRANTED TO MRS. MYRTLE GRAVES

A divorce was granted in Circuit Court at Pontiac, Monday to Mrs. Myrtle E. Graves of Orchard Lake and Farmington Roads, from Orin W. Graves of Grosse Ile. Mrs. Graves, who charged non-support was granted custody of their one child and alimony of \$5 per week. The couple were married in 1920 and separated five years later. Pelton and McGee represented Mrs. Graves.

ORDINANCE No. C-8-27
The City of Farmington Ordains. An Ordinance providing for the destruction of Noxious Weeds.

Section 1. No owner or occupant, firm or corporation having control or management of any property within the City of Farmington, shall allow any nuisance to be created or to exist on the premises of which such person, firm or corporation, is the owner

or exercises control or management thereof; nor shall any person, firm or corporation owning or occupying any public or private street, alley way or premises, whatever, or having control or management thereof, within the limits of the City of Farmington, create or maintain a nuisance thereon.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of Public Works to see that the provisions of this act are carried out within the limits of the City of Farmington.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of every owner, possessor or occupier of land or of every person or persons, firm or corporation having charge of any lands in this City of Farmington to cut or cause to be cut down and destroyed all Canada thistles, milkweed (asclepias cornutus), wild carrots, oxeye, daisies or other noxious weeds growing thereon, at least twice in each year, once before the first day of July and again before the first day of September, and as much oftener as may be necessary to prevent their going to seed, and if any owner, possessor of land, or any person or persons, firm or corporation having charge of any lands in this City of Farmington shall knowingly suffer any Canada thistles, milkweed, wild carrots or other noxious weeds to grow thereon, or shall suffer the seed to ripen, so as to cause or endanger the spread thereof, he or she shall, on conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction be liable to a fine of ten dollars, together with costs of prosecution, for every offense and he or she shall pay the cost of cutting and destroying such weeds and an additional ten per centum as hereinafter provided.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of Public Works in the City of Farmington to give general notice in the following manner to every owner, possessor or occupier of land and to every person or persons, firm or corporation having charge of any lands in this City of Farmington, whereon noxious weeds are growing, to cut and destroy such noxious weeds: Four notices each not less than two feet square shall be printed in clear readable type and posted one in each of conspicuous places in the City of Farmington, and notices shall also be published in some local paper having a general circulation in the City. These notices shall set forth the fact that all noxious weeds must be cut on or before a certain date, which date shall be fixed by the Superintendent of Public Works. The posting and publishing of such notices shall take place at least ten days prior to the date upon which the weeds must be cut, and such notice may read as follows:

To owners, possessors or occupiers of land, or any person or persons, firm or corporation having charge of any lands in this City of Farmington:

Notice is hereby given that all noxious weeds growing on any land in the City of Farmington, County of Oakland, must be cut down and destroyed on or before the 22nd day of August, A. D. 1927.

Failure to comply with this notice on or before the date mentioned or within ten days thereafter shall make the parties so failing liable for the costs of cutting same and an additional levy of ten per centum of such cost, to be levied and collected against the property in the same manner as other taxes are levied and collected.

Section 5. In case the owner, possessor or occupier of land, or the person or persons, firm or corporation having charge of any land shall refuse or neglect to comply with such notice and to cut the weeds or brush on or before the date stated in such notice or within ten days thereafter, it shall be the duty of the Superintendent of Public Works, or some one whom said Superintendent of Public Works may employ to assist in carrying on the work:

to enter upon the land and to cause all such noxious weeds to be cut down with as little damage to growing crops as may be, and he shall not be liable to be sued in any action of trespass therefor.

Section 6. Superintendent of Public Works shall keep an accurate account of the expense incurred by him in carrying out the provisions of Section 5 of this ordinance, with respect to each parcel of land entered upon therefor, and with respect to weeds and brush cut from any such parcel of land entered upon therefor, and shall make a sworn statement of such account and present same to the City Commission of the City of Farmington. The Commission is hereby authorized and required to audit and allow such account and order the same to be paid from the General fund of the said City of Farmington.

Section 7. The City Treasurer shall add to all such expenditures

as have been so audited and allowed: ten per centum of the amount of such expenditures and shall cause all such expenditures, together with the additional ten per centum, to be severally levied on the lands on which such expenditures were made, and the

same shall become a lien upon said land and shall be collected in the same manner as other City taxes are collected; the same when collected shall be paid into the general City fund to reimburse the outlay therefrom aforesaid.
