ARTHUR HOPKINS WILL
PRESENT "THE HOUSE OF
WOMEN" AT SHUBERT

Prior to its New York opening, Arthur Hopkins will present Elsie Ferguson and Nance O'Neil in "The House of Women" at the Shubert Detroit Opera House for a one-week engagement beginning Monday, September 19.

Miss Ferguson last appeared in Detroit in "The Grand Duchess and the Waiter," "The Moon Flower" and "The Varying Shore." "The House of Women" is based on Louis Bromfield's brilliant and popular novel, "The Green Bay Tree," dramatized by the author. It is the first of a panel of four novels, the third of which, "Early Autumn," was awarded the Pulitzer prize. The fourth, "A Good Woman," was published only a few weeks ago. Bromfield is 27 years of age.

The story of "The House of Women" deals with life in a great American steel town and of how industry gradually wipes out the settler stock. Two indomitable characters, Julia, the mother, and Lily, the daughter, eager, lawless beautiful, dominate the play.

"It's this way, your honor. I like women all right, and especially my wife, but like toast and coffee, I'll be darned if I like 'em cold."

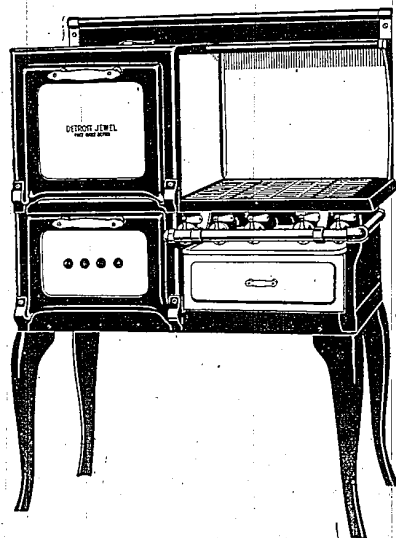
Cat Commits Suicide

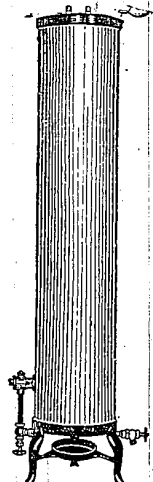
