
Thinking spring



Officials protest wetlands bills

residents and officials visited Laming last week to complain about two

"I think we should have public outrage over this," township Supervisor
Sandra Draur said. "It's budfrows

would require the Department of
Natural Resources to buy all the

Draur said the Senate natural resources and environmental affairs committee members seem determined to pass both bills, despite a standing-room-only crowd at last week's public hearing where opposition was "overwhelming."


