NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-18-91, an Ordinance to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmington Hills, Michigan, by adding a new article, Article XI, Temporary Signs, to Chapter 7, Buildings and Building Regulations, to regulate temporary freestanding and wall signs and banners in the City. This ordinance was adopted at a regular meeting held on October 21, 1991, and ordered publication of the following summary of the Ordinance, in accordance with Section 4.04 of the City Charter. Printed copies of the full text of the Ordinance are available for inspection and distribution to the public at the office of the City Clerk.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS.

Section 1.

Chapter 7, Buildings and Building Regulations of the City Code is hereby amended to add Article XI, Temporary Signs, which shall read as follows:

7-330. Definition.
Sign: Temporary Freestanding Sign; Temporary Grand Opening Sign; Temporary Wall Sign; Temporary Window Sign.

7-331. Temporary Freestanding or Wall Sign Requirements.

- (a) Prohibitions.
- (b) Permits Required.
- (c) One or Two Wall Signs Permitted Per Business Establishment or Use.
- (d) One Grand Opening Sign Permitted Per Business Establishment.
- (e) Setback and Corner Clearance.
- (f) Display Period - Wall Signs.
- (g) Display Period - Temporary Grand Opening Signs.
- (h) Projection into Right-of-Way.
- (i) Area and Height - Freestanding Signs.
- (j) Area and Height - Wall or Grand Opening Signs.
- (k) Removal.
- (l) Damaged or Unsafe.
- (m) Moving or Flashing Signs.

7-332. Temporary Window Sign Requirements.

- (a) Moving or Flashing Signs.
- (b) Area.

7-333. Appeals.

- Section 2. Repealer.
- Section 3. Severability.
- Section 4. Savings.
- Section 5. Effective Date: November 11, 1991
- Section 6. Enactment: October 21, 1991
