 From the condition of the bodies and because the television and lights were on, police believe the shootings took place anywhere from several hours before the bodies were found to the night before, Nebus said.  
 Police received a 911 emergency call at 4:18 p.m. Thursday from Jones' daughter. "She reported that she came into the house to check on her parents and found them dead in separate parts of the house," Nebus said. The daughter is from Jasper Jones' previous marriage. This was Susan Jones' first marriage. They were married 11 years, Nebus said.  
 THE HOUSE was locked, with no signs of forced entry or ransacking. "The house was extremely neat and orderly," Nebus said.  
 Though police are fairly certain the deaths were a murder-suicide they are continuing their investigation and evidence collection. Tests also will be conducted on the pistol to be sure it is the weapon that was used, Nebus said.
