### PUBLIC HEARING

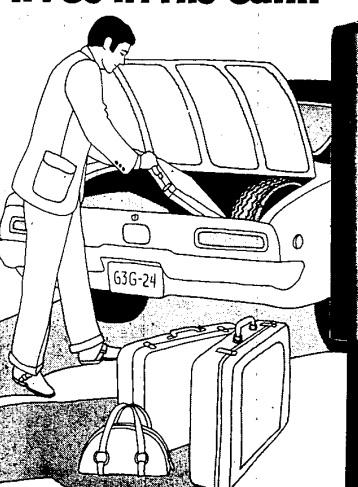
