Knowing some people with diabetes who exercise with me, I have concluded that diet and insulin dosages must be carefully monitored. You must get acquainted with how your body reacts to exercise.

This process is a slow one. Each person is unique; you must adjust to the demands of your own body. You will learn what to eat before you exercise and how to adjust insulin if you take it.

As you can see, I have assumed you take insulin daily. We must always go with the hardest scenario first.

If your diabetes its diet related, it will be easier to adjust exercise in your life. Each diabete has to find a routine of aerobic exercise that they can enjoy and that doesn't threaten their ability to maintain reasonable blood sugar control.

All these issues — diet, insulin (if any) and degree of exercise should be discussed with a doctor.
