The council will consider enacting ordinances regarding: buildings and building regulations and existing structures, the new state law providing for mandatory child restraints and seat belt usage, and one penalizing drivers overtaking or meeting a school bus under certain circumstances.

They will also hear a final report of the Carrington Place Senior Adult

Housing Committee, and consider adopting a resolution opposing a senate bill regulating wetlands and diminishing home rule.

Under new business, the council will hear a request from Sylvia Nelson regarding the effectiveness of electronic fence devices to confine dogs, consider mailing applicants for absentee voter ballots for the Presidential Primary election and consider introducing the following ordinance amendments:

- amending certain property descriptions for enumerated districts in the historical preservation ordinance.
- one to provide penalties for driving without a license and for impounding of motor vehicles under certain conditions.

● changing the city law to reflect the state's new drunk driving laws. The council will also consider a request from Farmington Hills Management Co. to transfer stock in Drakeshire Lanes, a Class C licensed business, and consider a recommendation from the Parks & Recreation Commission and ad hoc committee to establish procedures to name the Peltz/MDOT property.

The city manager will give a report on water system lead and copper sampling in Farmington Hills.
