Dr. Sallee, 67, formerly of Southfield, died Jan. 13 in Santa Fe, N.M.

Dr. Sallee was an ophthalmologist in Detroit from 1959 to 1985. He served in the United States Air Force as a medical officer from 1952 to 1959. He graduated from Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia in 1949 and served his residency in Indiana University School of Medicine. He moved to Michigan in 1959 and opened his private practice in Livonia. Shortly after, he joined a group practice with offices in Southfield and Farmington.

He served on the staff of St. Mary's Hospital in Livonia, Grace Hospital in Detroit and Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak. He was elected to Chief of the Division of Ophthalmology at Grace from 1972-1975.

Dr. Sallee held academic appointments at Wayne State University, College of Medicine, and was also an instructor for the American Academy of Ophthalmology and received the Academic Merit Award in 1971.

He was a member of the Wayne County Medical Society, Michigan State Medical Society, American Medical Association and the Detroit Ophthalmological Club. He moved to Santa Fe, N.M. in 1985 after his retirement from private practice.

Survivors include his wife, Betty; son, John; daughters, Christine Pantor, Deborah, and Kathleen Scheffer; five grandchildren.

Classes help cultivate kids' interests

A large variety of classes for kids are being offered through the Farmington Public Schools' Community Education Department. All elementary schools will have class offerings, along with Farmington High School's Saturday morning programming. The Children's Community Education winter brochure was sent home with elementary students. Details on class offerings can be found there, or by calling the Community School at 489-3133. Listed below is a sampling of some of the classes included in the

winter brochure:

- Community Ed Children's Chorus — No auditions are necessary for this group which combines traditional and contemporary songs. The chorus performs for senior adults and other community audiences.

- Art Around the World — In this course, children create international art projects from Africa, France, Mexico, Japan and other lands, as well as sampling foods and learning about the customs of these countries.

- Bicycle Basics — This course

includes hands-on repairing from maintenance to flat tires and teaches items like gear and brake adjustments.

- Creative Drama Workshop — Taught by an Actor's Alliance faculty member, class includes acting, oral interpretation, improvisation, body movement and theatre games.

- Cartoon Creations — Freelance cartoonist teaches children to create their own personalized cartoons.

- First Aid/CPR — This is taught by a paramedic or certified

Red Cross instructor. Practise first aid, rescue breathing, fire and water safety, bicycle safety and more. Also taught are avoidance of physical abuse, the dangers of drugs and household poisons.

- My Body, Myself — Here, students will study the human anatomy and make a skeleton complete with organs, cells and body parts.

- Plaster Master — Students can make plaster models and complete them in one class period.

- Sign Language — The basics of sign language plus simple songs and stories are part of this lesson,

which also teaches about the hearing impaired. Students will perform their skills at the end of the course.

- Softball Skills — This is a new offering which teaches the basics of the game of softball including various positions, hitting, throwing, fielding and baserunning.

- Living Science Foundation — Four different classes for the whole family are offered at Farmington High School on Saturday morning, Feb. 1. The Nov.-based Living Science group brings live animals for a hands-on lesson.

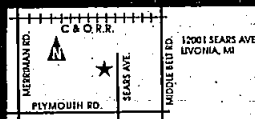

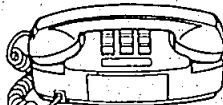

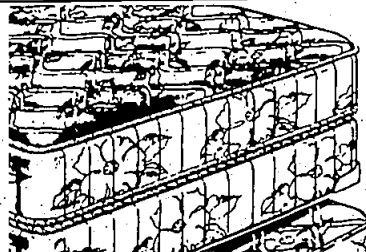
