

**police/fire calls**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

**SEXUAL ASSAULT REPORTED**

A 21-year-old West Bloomfield woman told Farmington Hills police she was sexually assaulted at a party in a Farmington Hills hotel room Saturday, according to a police report.

The woman rented a room at the Clarion Inn, 31525 12 Mile, for a small party with a West Bloomfield friend and two 25-year-old male friends, one from Pontiac, the other from Keego Harbor.

During the party, all participants drank. The woman told police she had too much to drink and laid down on one of the two double beds in the room. She told the two men they could stay in the room until they were sober enough to drive home.

The woman told police she passed

out on the bed before the partygoers left. She awakened to find the two men fondling her on the bed where she fell asleep. She then left the room, ran down the hall and called police. When police arrived she told them she was too upset to talk with them. She made the report later at the police department.

The two men apparently fled the motel, carrying the leftover liquor in two pillowcases. The woman told police one of the two men cornered her in the motel bathroom earlier in the party.

**BB DAMAGE**

Two BB pistols and cartridges were confiscated from three Farmington Hills youths after a resident of Diamond Forest Apartments near Tina and Halsted complained that they were shooting at a nearby subdivision sign, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

When police arrived they found empty cans with holes and dents

around the sign and a broken light. Police said it appeared the cans were shot by BBs.

When the youths finished playing with the BB guns, they ran to a nearby house, the home of one of the boys. Police arrived and confiscated one of the BB guns. While patting down one of the youths, they found and confiscated a second gun.

The youths told police they were practicing shooting at the cans and that they didn't intend to break the light. Police are investigating.

**KITCHEN FIRE**

An apartment resident suffered smoke inhalation when two plastic ice cube trays were left on a burner of an electric range at a unit of the Strawberry Apartments near Middlebelt, south of 12 Mile, Sunday, according to a Farmington Hills fire report.

A neighbor extinguished the fire with a portable dry chemical extinguisher while firefighters removed

smoke from the apartment. Damage was estimated at \$100.

The apartment resident was transported to Providence Hospital, Southfield, for treatment.

**THEFTS REPORTED**

Speakers, a stereo receiver and drill with a total value of \$940 were reported stolen from a house on Wildwood Trail, Jan. 11.

A 1992 Jeep valued at \$22,000 was reported stolen from Bob Saks Jeep, 35300 Grand River, Dec. 16-Jan. 9.

**DAMAGE REPORTED**

Damage was estimated at \$1,000 after someone smashed each letter of the Pace Warehouse sign, 24800 Haggerty, Jan. 9-10.

Three cars at Holiday Chevrolet, 30250 Grand River, were damaged when someone drilled the door locks and dashboards. Damage was estimated at \$1,000. An AM/FM radio, valued at \$1,500 was also reported stolen from one of the cars.
