'Dynamo Duck' will (ouch) quack you up

Nestled amid Fox Children's Network's Saturday morning programming, a tiny gem of a program glimmers among the layers of animated adventure and breakfast-cereal commercials. Lasting only two minutes at a time and starring a cast of five, strangely cooperative animals, *The Adventures of Dynamo Duck* is prepared to strike unsuspecting funny bones without notice.

In *Dynamo Duck*, Fox has pieced together footage acquired from French animal trainer Jean Tourane to create an original and highly entertaining interstitial, or "connecting," programming device. The down-feather detective waddles in and out of tiny sets inhabited by villainous hamsters, rabbits and guinea pigs, all plotting to trick him with their clever disguises

and ceaseless jabbering. Like the great Homo sapien detectives before him, Dynamo Duck allows a string of feminine fakes and double agents to believe he's been fooled, then dashes their evil plans at the last minute, which, on this show, actually takes only a minute.

Dan Castellana, a talented comedian who will forever be known as the voice of Homer Simpson, again hops aboard the Fox voice-over gravy train this time as the voice behind the duck. His circa-1940s gumshoe banter sounds like it was lifted right off the soundtrack of *The Maltese Falcon* and, really, er, fills the bill.
