directly to their dispatch board if someone needs road service," Cohen said. "This cuts time to a minimum."

"Once in a while we'll get a call reporting a crime, such as a breaking and entering, in progress, or a home emergency. Last week we had a woman call in to request aid for her child who had a high fever and other serious symptoms."

"If we get a report of a traffic jam due to an accident or stalled car, it is broadcast on the WJR radio traffic advisory so drivers can avoid the jam-up area," Cohen said.

"THIS SERVICE is operated year 'round. In addition, on Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day, a short bus organization members patrol the area between Brighton and Southfield in 1-96.

"A base station is set up at the Novi rest area," Cohen said. "We run two-way cars equipped with radios, flares, fire extinguishers, and first aid kits. We always carry extra water for overheated cars. In a typical holiday weekend, we'll encounter about 100 distressed cars."

"Our main objective is communication between citizens and operators and police," Cohen said.

A patrol applicant must undergo police, insurance, and character investigations before he is allowed to use the MEP call sign, KBW-5826. If you are a citizens' band operator, the MEP and their call sign, KBW-5826, might be a good thing to remember sometime.
