PLYMOUTH Eight music scholarship checks will be awarded by conductor Wayne Dunlap at the annual meeting and potluck dinner of the Plymouth Symphony Society Wednesday, May 19, at 6:30 p.m., in Middle School West, Sheldon Rd. at Ann Arbor Tr.

The meeting and awards presentation will be held during Plymouth Symphony Week, May 15 to 22.

Plans for the coming year will be discussed at the meeting.

RECEIVING THE society's award as the outstanding player to audition will be Laura Jender, an eighth grade student at Middle School West. She will receive the Russell Isbister memorial award.

AWARDS OF \$75 will go to Libby Glover, string bass;

Mark Norfleet, string bass; and Carole Surratt, viola. Four other teenagers will receive \$50 awards. They are violinists: Paul Albert, David Doty and Carol Whitman, and Barbara Smith, who plays the viola.

The scholarships are awarded to enable promising students to further their studies at the National Music Camp, Interlochen, or other summer music schools.

The winners were chosen after auditions with Michael Endres, director of the Plymouth Youth Symphony; Nicholas Werdel, Livonia Schools music instructor; and Dunlap.

ALL MEMBERS of the society may attend the meeting. Meat and beverage will be provided by the Women's Symphony League. Members are asked to bring their own service and a dish to pass.

The brief business meeting will include nomination of four new board members to replace Mrs. William Birge, Karl Jabara, Arthur Larson and Mrs. Thomas Powell. Their terms expire in June.

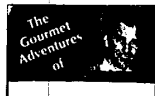

Planking is a method of serving fish rather than of cooking it. Since the arrangement takes time, planked fish will probably be served only on special occasions. Fish with thick flesh is best suited to planking. Arrange the fish on a wooden plank or plate, sprinkle with salt and pepper, brush with melted butter or French dressing. Bake in a moderate oven for 20 to 30 min., meanwhile preparing two to three vegetables. Arrange a border of mashed potato around the fish when done, making a nest for each vegetable. Add vegetables, garnish with parsley, and serve.
