

Missionary Conference Runs 8 Days In Livonia

The theme "To Make Christ Known" is developed throughout an eight-day missionary conference in Westland Baptist Church of Livonia, 35375 Ann Arbor Trail.

The conference, running from Saturday, May 15, through Sunday, May 23, features missionary speakers, films, colored slides, exhibits, panel discussions and field reports.

The Rev. Harold W. Fife, minister-at-large with the Far Eastern Gospel Crusade, is among the speakers who will be introduced at a family international potluck supper at 6 p.m., Saturday, May 15.

An outstanding Bible expositor, Rev. Fife has been pastor in several churches in England and Canada and taught missions and homiletics at Central Baptist Seminary in Toronto.
