gler's State of the State speech op-position to ralsing gas taxes for roads. "It's really unfortunate because the gas tax money is the money which is used for the daily mainte-nance of roads." Joy said. "We have 428 more, miles of road in Oakland County than in 1984 when the last gas tax hike was imple-mented. Yet we have the same number of employees and trucks. All out trucks are 10-15 years old. "This past storm proves how hard it is to get things done." All the hype about federal funds isn't going to help Oakland County you must come up with matching funds and "there is no money here for matches."

The federal funds will go to the Michigan Department of Transpor-

ation to build new roads we can' ation to build new roads we can't maintain, he claims. Legislators such as Rep. John Gennett, D-Reford, raised an eys-brow at Engler's opposition to a fuel tax increase. "How are we gonna improve roads?" he asked. Said Rep. Dennis Hertel, D-De-troit, chairman of the House Trans-portation Committee: "Without ad-ditional revenue, it (road building) is going to be jecpardized."
