**Cable TV needs computer buffs**

The Community Access Computer Group, according to resident Mark Adler, has begun with five residents with computer backgrounds. The CAGC needs volunteers even more with all levels of computer experience.

The people will be helping to install "magic" with present and future community access computer systems, Adler said. The computer group's goal is to have important information available from both administrative and creative aspects of community television, he said.

This would include crew schedules, studio use statistics, computer-generated graphics, and community access bulletin boards. Those who are becoming involved with this project will have an introductory orientation workshop about community access. During the week of Oct. 24, a workshop for computer use will be held.
